Turtle

Nesting season is strongest during the summer months. By cleaning up this beach at the beginning of nesting season, it will enhance the potential success rate for the female turtles coming ashore to lay their eggs and subsequent emerging of the baby sea turtle hatchlings as they race to their aqueous future homes without being deterred by flotsam on their beach. Volunteers arrive early morning at Long Key State Park for instructions & boat transportation to target beach site where they will spend most of the day combing beach for litter, picking it up and bagging the debris, transport bagged garbage by boat to a designated pick-up location, transport back by boat to the original morning's departure point, and celebrate their day's success with an old fashioned cookout/picnic at the state park.

Southwest Florida Gator Club® 5 /16/2009 Bill Turner Randell Research Center

The Randell Research Center (RRC) is a program of the Florida Museum of Natural History, which has conducted research and education programs in Southwest Florida for more than 20 years. The RRC has existed since 1994 when Donald and Patricia Randell gifted 53 +/- acres of the 200-acre, Pineland archaeological site to the University of Florida Foundation. The Mission of the RRC is to establish and maintain, at the internationally significant Pineland archaeological and historical site, a permanent facility dedicated to learning and teaching the archaeology, history, and ecology of Southwest Florida. The activity, specifically, would be consolidating larger pieces of trash into piles and bagging the smaller stuff in construction trash bags.

Another possibility is adopting a mound. We have Calusa mounds which are in need of care. "Care" translates into removing some exotic invasive plants and/or chemically treating their cuttings, clearing vegetation from fences, and in the case of at least one mound, picking up leftover construction debris (roof tiles, etc.) from Hurricane Charley. This activity could be an ongoing one, with repeats every year for International Gator Day.
